

Autism Diagnostic Observation Schedule - ADOS-2

Administration and coding training Geneva, May 19th - 22nd, 2016

ADOS-2 is the latest revision of the Autism Diagnostic Observation Schedule, **the most widely used observational assessment in the diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorders**, in clinical and research settings. In its current version, ADOS-2 reflects the DSM-5.

The training

- The training takes place over 4 days and covers the age span from 12 months through to adulthood.
- Trainees will learn how to administer and code ADOS-2 for all ages through watching and coding videos of the assessments, and through discussion with trainers.
- Trainees will also have the opportunity to practice with the actual activities and materials of ADOS-2.
- The trainers are Marianna Murin (Great Ormond Street Hospital for Children, London) and Dr Chiara Fiorentini (Fondation Pôle Autisme, Geneva).
- The training will be held in English.

Who is it for?

Professionals wishing to use the ADOS-2 as part of clinical practice or a research project should attend the training.

What will I get from the training?

- Knowledge for administering and coding ADOS-2.
- Opportunities to network.
- Expert feedback.
- A certificate of attendance, enabling trainees to administer and code ADOS-2 in clinical practice. This requires completion of postwork assignments.

Research Reliability

 Trainees wishing to receive an additional certification of research reliability can choose to submit 2 additional postcourse assignments (at an extra cost of CHF 300.-).



The trainers

The ADOS-2 trainers for this course are Marianna Murin (*National Centre for Autism Spectrum Disorders* at the *Great Ormond Street Hospital for Children*, London) and Dr Chiara Fiorentini (Fondation Pôle Autisme).

Marianna Murin works as a *Principal Clinical Psychologist* at the *Great Ormond Street Hospital for Children*, London. She specializes in in-depth assessment, diagnostics and treatment for children and young people with complex presentations, suspected Autism Spectrum Disorders and other co-morbid mental health and neurodevelopmental problems.

Dr. Chiara Fiorentini is a *Clinical Psychologist* at the *Consultation Centre for Autism Spectrum Disorders (CCSA)* of the *Fondation Pôle Autisme* as well as a *Post-Doctoral Researcher* at the *Faculty of Psychology and Educational Sciences* of the *University of Geneva*, where she does research on socio-emotional development of typical and special needs children.
